In case of any emergencies, the patient will be shifted to Chettinad Hospital with the help of their ambulance. I appreciate that the cost of treatment is highly subsidized and is affordable by the patients.

I am very much confident that Sankara Rural Medical Centre with the medical management of Chettinad Hospital will discharge their functions in an excel manner and beyond people's expectations.

Donald M. Berwick, President Emeritus and Senior Fellow at the Institute for Healthcare Improvement, and former Administrator of the Centre for Medicare and Medicaid Services, and also a top paeditrician at Harvard, USA, said, and I quote, "Those who suffer need you to be something more than a doctor; they need you to be a healer. And, to become a healer, you must do something even more difficult than putting your white coat on. You must take your white coat off. Sushruta, Jivaka Kumarabhacca, and Charaka were famous medical experts who showed the world how to treat diseases and illnesses. At a time when surgeries in England were done primitively, the most complex surgeries were being performed in India by well trained surgeons.

Sushruta is credited with performing advanced surgeries, including plastic and reconstructive surgery. Sushruta was not just a great surgeon, but also a great teacher. He used to advise his students that however well-read they could be, they were not

competent to treat disease until they had practical, hands-on experience. He taught his students surgical skills by making incisions on the skin of fruits. He also taught them how to remove foreign bodies from flesh by demonstrating the extraction of seeds from fruits. His students were known to have practised on dead animals and on leather bags filled with water, before they performed surgeries on patients.

It is a matter of great significance to see that this hospital is being located in a rural area which gives me satisfaction and happiness.

Let me summarise by saying that the mission before us is to make health care comprehensive, universal, affordable and qualitatively professional. For achieving this objective, the road ahead is going to be complex and arduous.

It is important for us to work together in a constructive manner to fight the common enemy i.e. disease. All of us should join hands and march together so that we achieve success.

I wish to conclude by saying that the members of the medical profession are not merely doctors. To the patient they are saviours and the pain-relieving messiahs. The medical profession is a noble profession. In the words of the famous French philosopher Voltaire, "Those who are occupied in the restoration of health to others, by the joint exertion of skill and humanity, are above all the great of the earth. They even partake of divinity, since to preserve and renew is almost as noble as to create".
