We should thank the initiatives taken by our Hon'ble Prime Minister Thiru Narendra Modi Ji to connect all un-electrified rural and urban households with power connection under "The Saubhagya Yojana". This project will also focus on installing distributed generation system in rural areas, through solar panels.
