The British through devious means bought about the downfall of his company and also subsequently detained him causing great misery ad suffering to his family which descended from prosperity to utter penury.

The patriotic slogan Jai Hind was raised by Senbagaraman who hailed from Kanyakumari District. One cannot forget the great sacrifice done by Vanchinathan, a Government official who resigned his job to participate in the freedom struggle. His

assassination of the British Collector Ash Durai remains unforgettable even today. The younger generation should know about the great sacrifices done by Vellunachiar and her commandant Kuyili who destroyed a British army camp by jumping into the arms and ammunition stock yard.

The great sacrifices of Maruthu Brothers, Veera Pandiya Kattabomman, Sundaralingam, Oomai Thurai, Theeran Chinnamalai, Subramania Siva, Mahakavi Bharathi, Cuddalore Anjalai Ammal, Thiru V. Kalyana Sundaram, Jeevananadam, Pasumpon Muthuramalinga Thevar, Rajagopalachariar, Kamaraj and Kakkan will make every reader feel inspired and passionate about the nation and its people.

**Mahatma Gandhi** and other notable greats of his era such as Annie Besant, Lala Lajpat Rai, Bal Gangadhar Tilak, Bipin Chandra Pal, Nethaji Subhas Chandra Bose, Sardar Vallabhbhai Patel and Jawaharlal Nehru have also been covered beautifully in the book.
