## STUDY THE NEP THOROUGHLY, CAREFULLY, DEEP AND WIDE TO DISCUSS ON IT FURTHER AND TO UNDERSTAND THE SCOPE AND BENEFIT OF THE POLICY - SAID, GOVERNOR OF TAMIL NADU

Hon'ble Governor of Tamil Nadu, Thiru.R.N.Ravi inaugurated two days conference of Central University Vice-Chancellors, on "Devising Action Plan for Faster and Smoother Implementation of National Education Policy (NEP) - 2020" at Central University of Tamil Nadu, Tiruvarur, today (27.05.2022).

How the British systematically killed the indigenous education system, industry, agriculture and social institutions. He narrated how intellectuals like Karl Marx had written essays in the New York Daily Tribune in 1852 asking the British for totally annihilate the Indian social order and lay foundation of a Western magical civilization. How the British had commissioned James Mill to write a derogatory concocted history of India which become the text book.

Now the National Education Policy-2020 among other things stresses on re-discovering pride in our past including the Indian knowledge system and the spirit to support this revolutionary transformation. The policy is comprehensive, and exhaustive. It addresses linguistic diversity as the strength in the inclusive development of the Nation. It ensures better scope for Bharathiya Knowledge System.

Hon'ble Governor expressed his confidence that this conclave will come up with needed action plan for implementation of NEP-2020. He also urged the scholars to carry out in depth researches on pre-colonial glory of India and reestablish the lost links of our Bharathiya Knowledge System.

Nation is celebrating "Azadi-Ka-Amrit Mahotsav", 75 years of India's independence; the country is marching ahead with unprecedented self-confidence and determination. Next quarter century of "Amrit Kaal" is crucial phase for our Nation. By 2047 when the country will celebrate 100 years of Independence, India has to be the world leader. The NEP 2020 lays down the way forward to this goal.
